## **HISTORICAL VISIT TO YORK**

Over 100 year 11 historians went to visit the city of York as part of their learning on Norman England. Firstly, they visited Clifford's Tower, a well preserved Motte and Bailey Norman castle, which was vital to the Norman's control of York. Next they went to Jorvik Viking Museum to look at what York was like before the Norman invasion and conquest.

The students were then allowed some shopping time on the historic 'shambles', which is one of the best preserved medieval streets in Britain. Finally, they ended the day at the magnificent York Minster. This was built by the Normans to show their wealth, power and their close relationship with God, to justify their conquest of England and intimidate the people in the north.
