MOBILE PHONE POLICY

As of next term (starting Monday 3 June) no electronic device, including mobile phones and smart watches, will be allowed to be used, seen or heard in school, both in class and at break and lunch.

This new policy comes into place following guidance issued from the Department for Education. We want students to be fully focused on their learning and enjoy their social time at school without being distracted by phones.

We recognise that students may need their phones when travelling to and from school, but if they then choose to bring them into school they must be turned off and put away. Should we see a child with their electronic device we will:

- Confiscate it immediately.
- The first time it is confiscated a student will be allowed to collect it at the end of the day from reception.
- In the case of subsequent instances, parents will be informed and will be required to pick up the device from reception at their convenience. Reception is staffed from 8am-4pm, Monday-Thursday and 8am-3.30pm on Friday.
- Should a parent need to contact their child in the event of an emergency situation, please phone reception on 01254 505700.
