Whilst at school the MPs spoke with staff and students about the subject and commented on how confident and passionate both staff and students were. We stressed that no child will ever go hungry at BCHS, it's something we feel very strongly about. Kate was also pleased to hear that we already have free breakfast in place for all students.

She will now take these discussions and feed back our comments to central government.

## **HISTORY TRIPS GALORE**

The History department has been busy providing lots of opportunities to explore history outside of the classroom. Previously in the year we ran separate year seven and year 11 trips to the historic city of York. More recently, year eight students went to Quarry Bank Mill to bring to life their learning of working conditions in Industrial Revolution factories and to learn how these factories impact the local town and the lives of the people living there. In May, year nine students visited the Royal Armouries Museum in Leeds. They then visited the Thackray Medicine Museum where they walked down Disease Street and investigated the link between living conditions throughout history, the diseases which occurred and how the people of Britain tried to fight the diseases and improve people's lives. Just last week year nine were given an amazing opportunity to study the current conflict in Palestine. They learnt about the origins of the conflict, the possible solutions and were able to speak to someone from each side of the conflict and hear first-hand what people living in the region are living through and about their hopes for the future. All amazing opportunities to bring history to life for our learners!
