Course Outline	<p>BTECs are work related qualifications suitable which provide a more practical, real-world approach to learning alongside a key theoretical background. BTECs are different from GCSE's in that students will complete a series of mandatory units in which they will be tested by external exam, complete set course work and complete practical tasks; however this means that students have to complete a series of written or practical assignments with a vocational scenario.</p> <p>In order to complete the qualification students must complete these units:</p> <p>Component 1: Human Lifespan Development - unit coursework</p> <p>Component 1: Health and Social Care Services and Values - unit coursework</p> <p>Component 3: Promoting Health and Well-being - external exam</p>
Progression Routes to Further Education/ Training	<p>Students will develop a range of personal skills and techniques, through the selection of units that are essential for successful performance in working life, and gain a broad understanding and knowledge of the health and social care sector.</p> <p>This course can lead on to a level 3 qualification in Health & Social Care or Childcare or A-levels.</p>
Progression Routes to Employment	This course will provide a good foundation to all the health and social care professions studied at degree level.
