ENTERPRISE CHALLENGE

Year 8 students took part in the M&G Skills for Life Enterprise Challenge workshop, which gives students the opportunity to act as large-scale event organisers in charge of arranging a pop concert for 10,000 young people. They worked amazingly as part of a team and we are so proud to announce that the girls qualified in the top ten in the North West.






STARS IN OUR SCHOOLS 👟
