# **BCHS IN THE COMMUNITY**

Some of our junior leadership team represented BCHS at a special service at Blackburn Cathedral, in recognition of Holocaust Memorial Day and the 80th year since the camps were liberated. The service also remembered all people who lost their lives in genocides across the world.

The service, organised by the Interfaith Forum of Blackburn with Darwen (BwD), saw various dignitaries, including the Mayor, Leader of BwD Council and the Dean of Blackburn, give a short speech, before the religious leaders spoke of remembering lives that were lost. Candles were lit in remembrance, along with a minute's silence for those who had perished.

Ethan Woods, Deputy Youth MP for BwD, read reflections from school students across BwD, on the theme "For a Better Future". A statement written by our junior leadership team was included.







### **ATTENDANCE MATTERS**

A huge well done to all those students who achieved 100% attendance so far this year. There are over 100 students who have maintained the 100% throughout the academic year and over 400 students who have achieved it this term.

All of these students will receive a 100% badge and will have the opportunity to win a restaurant voucher. Attendance is celebrated in assembly and on the attendance noticeboard in school.

In addition, 30 students this term had the opportunity to participate in a free school trip to Manchester Museum. This included the very popular 'Power Up' hands on exhibition, where students could explore computer games over the decades.

We wanted to take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued support in ensuring your child attends school regularly. We cannot underestimate the importance of good attendance, as even small amounts of missed school can have a significant impact over time.

#### **TAKING HOLIDAYS?**

All requests for holidays during term time must be received in writing. A holiday taken during term time could result in a penalty notice. If issued, penalty notices are issued to each parent of each child and the amount of the penalty will be £160 to be paid within 28 days (£80 if paid within 21 days). Penalty notices will also be considered for 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

## **FEELING UNWELL?**

Often a child will wake up in the morning saying they feel unwell. Always try and send your child to school if they are a little 'under the weather', for example with a runny nose, headache or stomach ache. The school will always contact you if your child is unwell, which is why it is vitally important that we have your correct contact details.

Absence from school causes gaps in children's knowledge and understanding. As children progress through school they build on their existing knowledge, however children who have gaps struggle to grasp next steps. As well as the negative impact this has on progress, it can also lead to a lack of confidence and cause low self-esteem, stress and anxiety.
